Sign Up For Wareham Water Alert (RAVE Smart911)

Wareham Water has teamed with the Town of Wareham and Onset Fire District on a new reverse 911 system. This system updates how we communicate with you during an emergency by providing more social media outlets as well as traditional phone calls. Sign up at the URL below for alerts and stay informed! information. Note that the existing reverse 911 (Code Red) will be removed along with any information that was in that database.

Free Water Service Line

The water service line to your property is partly owned by you (See Figure entitled "Service Connection to Heated Building Interior"). Wareham Water estimates over 5% or more of our unaccounted for water is associated with leaks on private service lines making the water more expensive to provide to you. We encourage you to replace your service line with a plastic service line if the current service line material is composed of metal (e.g. steel, copper, lead, etc.). We can provide leak detection services to assist and will provide you with the plastic service line material (as time and funds permit with other projects). Details are provided at the District's office. A list of approved contractors for service line installation can be found with our front office. Installation costs are covered by the owner.

Value of Water Circa 1907

Wareham Water recently obtained an original copy of the Rates, Rules, and Regulations Governing Water Use, dated 1907. An electronic version can be found on our Facebook page at Wareham Water.

District, residential water was charged at a flat fee. Businesses were exempt from fees as their water was metered. Fees for residential water usage are outlined below:

Annual Fee

Dwellings

- First house faucet: \$8.00
- Additional faucets: \$3.00/ea.
- First water closet: \$8.00
- Additional water closets: \$5.00/ea.

At the inception of the Wareham Fire

- ♦ First bath tub: \$5.00
- Additional bath tub: \$2.00/ea.


Stables

- ♦ First Horse: \$5.00
- ♦ Additional Horses: \$2.00/ea.
- ♦ First Cow: \$2.00
- ♦ Additional Cows: \$1.00/ea.

Hose

Lawn Sprinkler, one-hour/day: \$10.00

Similar to today, water bills were collected twice a year in 1907 (business water bills were collected quarterly). We do not know what a typical bill was, but using a modern home (1.5 baths) we come up with the following annual bill.



Two additional Faucets: \$6.00

♦ First water closet: \$8.00

Additional water closet: \$5.00

First bath tub: \$5.00
First Horse: \$5.00
Lawn Sprinkler: \$10.00

Total: \$47 per year. Inflation runs between 2% and 3% per year on average over the long term. Forecasting the total future value of a 1910 bill for 117 years yields a bill of \$475 - \$1,500 per year today.

Note: The average US worker made \$438 per year in 1910 and likely only had minimal fixtures. (https://usa.usembassy.de/etexts/his/e_prices I.htm). Assuming the average person had one faucet and one horse for \$13 per year, yields a bill that is 3.0% of total average income.

The average annual bill today is roughly \$500 to \$600 per year. According to CityData.com the per capita income in Wareham is \$30,000 (household income: \$55,000) which yields 1.0% to 2.0% of total income for drinking water. We have provided the infographic "Water: What is it worth to you?" to provide perspective on the cost of pure drinking water within the USA compared to other utilities.




